## **CASE 009**



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51-year-old male with dyspepsia.

## **CLINICAL HISTORY AND IMAGING FINDINGS**

The patient, a 51-year-old man, presented with dyspepsia, and an upper gastrointestinal endoscopy (Figure 1) showed a 2.4 x 2.0 cm, round, hypoechoic, and enhancing submucosal lesion in the gastric antrum causing mass effect. An endoscopic ultrasound-guided fine needle aspiration (EUS-FNA) was performed and the slides along with the cytology cell block material were submitted for pathologic assessment.

## **PATHOLOGIC FEATURES**

**Cytologic Features:** The EUS-FNA smears received for review showed cohesive clusters of uniform round cells with ill-defined cytoplasmic borders and scant amphophilic cytoplasm, admixed with spindle shaped endothelial cells (Figure 2). The nuclei were round with smooth nuclear membranes and evenly distributed dusty chromatin




