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


Primary Mucinous Cystadenocarcinoma of the Breast: A rare case with Review of literature


CLINICAL HISTORY:

A 45-year-old female presented with pain and palpable mass in left breast since 1 month. All laboratory investigations of basic blood counts, including erythrocyte sedimentation rate, were within normal limits. Radiologic evaluations demonstrated a single slightly heterogenous hypoechoic mass having irregular micro-lobular margins in left breast on ultrasonography. A possibility of breast carcinoma was suggested and based on this, lumpectomy was planned and carried out.









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
